From the Pastor's Desk

The Rosary and Life

Peace to you! Well, I will be just returning from Europe on Saturday evening and what a great trip it was. We kick off the month of October with Respect Life Sunday (October 2) and recall that October is the month dedicated to the Holy Rosary, which is an incredibly powerful and ancient prayer. Please consider joining me in the Life Chain event up in La Crosse on Losey Boulevard from 2-3 PM today (Sunday October 2). This is a prayerful event whose purpose is to proclaim, via silent witness that abortion is wrong and that all human life is precious and worthy of protection.

I must admit, that although my family prayed the rosary together when I was growing up (every day during Lent), my devotion to Our Lady and to praying the rosary really did not take root until sometime in my latter seminary years and first couple years of priesthood. By "take root" I mean that it has become an important part of my daily life and my spiritual growth. I used to think that, since I did not "get much" out of praying the rosary, that I was just not "that type" of person. But, praise the Lord, I somehow stuck with it and kept trying. Eventually, something clicked for me. Actually, a few things:

1. The rosary is not just a "check the box" prayer, but a personal conversation with Our Lord and His Mother. Sometimes I approach times of prayer with a "let's just get this over with" attitude. But the more I've gotten to know Jesus and Mary, the more I desire to spend some time with them. I think that this is true for all types of prayer, not just the rosary.

2. Mary is my mother. I have always known this on an intellectual level, but it took quite some time for this to sink in on a personal, emotional, and spiritual level. That the Mother of God is also my mother who is not just a spectator of my life has been a game-changer. She walks with me daily with motherly concern.

3. The rosary helps to calm my mind and my soul. And I don't mean this in a self-help or therapeutic sort of way. The rosary is much deeper than that. When I pray it conscientiously, I bring all of the worries, struggles, and burdens of my life to Jesus and Mary. I have started to notice that, when I share myself with Jesus and Mary, then they have started to share themselves with me. That is, their earthly life has come to life for me. The events marked by the mysteries of the rosary (e.g. the birth of Jesus, the wedding at Cana, the crowning with thorns, the descent of the Holy Spirit, etc...) are becoming for me not just a story, but a real part of my life. It is similar to the way that a major event in the life of one of your friends impacts your own life. Their life is intertwined with yours. Jesus' and Mary's lives are becoming that for me. I am beginning to see them as real people with real feelings, thoughts, and desires. I find myself understanding Jesus and Mary. "What were you feeling, Mary, when there was no room in the inn?" and many similar thoughts come to mind now when I pray the rosary. I realize that Mary and Jesus are not far from me, either emotionally, experientially, or personally. And *that* calms my heart and mind in my daily frustrations and difficulties.

There is so much more to say about the rosary: How it has been a powerful spiritual weapon so many times in the Church's history (read about the Battle of Lepanto, probably the most important sea battle in European history, which took place on October 7, 1571), how it forms in us a habit of prayer, how it has converted thousands to the true faith, how God has poured forth countless graces upon His people through it, especially the grace of chastity, how it has helped a countless number of people break free from addictions, and the list goes on. In other words, I cannot recommend highly enough the daily praying of the rosary at least in a small part. Some practical and personal advice for doing this:

1. Start small and then build. Commit to praying one decade of the rosary every day. But try to pray more than that.

2. Build it into your routine. I often pray it in the car instead of listening to the radio. This also helps me stay calmer when encountering bad drivers!

3. Pray it in chunks. I rarely pray a whole rosary (5 decades) all at one time during the day. A couple decades here and there throughout the day helps me to remain in a spirit of prayer and relate my daily life to that of Jesus and Mary.

4. If you "fall off the bus," don't be too proud and just hop back on. Even now, although I desire to pray the rosary every day, sometimes I don't because I forget or I don't prioritize my day well or I am lazy. But I am learning to swallow my pride and recognize that I am still a "work-in-progress," loved by God.

I hope that you too can experience the countless blessings and graces that I and millions of others have received from praying the rosary every day. I especially desire that you will come to know and love Our Lord and our Blessed Mother personally. Her intercession is powerful, and so we ask that she pray for us and help our world embrace a culture of life.
