Altar Servers - The server assists the presider; prepares the altar; makes sure that what is needed for the celebration is brought, carried or moved into place. The server is concerned with almost every aspect of the celebration of the liturgy.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion - An Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion is a layperson formally instituted to distribute Holy Communion during Mass. After proper instruction, many parishioners serve as Eucharistic Ministers at weekend Masses.

Lector - This ministry helps to facilitate the public prayer of the Church in the Liturgy of the Word. Lectors strive to make the Liturgy of the Word as meaningful as possible for the worshipping assembly, celebrated in a way that fosters meditation. After proper instruction, the Lectors proclaim the Word of God for our daily and weekend liturgies.

Sacristan - The sacristans help prepare the physical elements necessary for celebrating the Mass. They ready the sacred vessels for the Eucharistic Liturgy (weekends), setting out appropriate quantities of bread and wine for Mass. Following the celebration of Mass, the sacristans will oversee the putting away of the sacred vessels in the sacristy and prepare them for the next Mass.

Music Ministry - The Music Ministry intends to lead and inspire our parish family to praise God with our voices at weekend liturgies and other parish services through-out the year.

Usher - The ushers greet you, help you find a seat, count attendance, pass the collection baskets, distribute the bulletin, offer assistance, and ensure an orderly process during the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Rosary Leaders – Parishioners lead the faithful in praying the rosary before the weekend Masses.

Finance Council - The diocese provides policies and procedures to which all parish and mission financial councils must adhere. There is a significant responsibility associated with being stewards of the temporal resources of the Church. The members of the finance council have the responsibility to safeguard the Church's assets, to exercise prudence in financial matters, to be accountable to those who provide monetary support to the Church, and to comply with all civil regulations.

Parish Council - Their role is to bring concerns that affect the whole parish to the attention of the pastor. The members of the council represent the parish ministries and organizations.

Building and Grounds – This committee oversees and makes decisions regarding the well-being and maintenance of the physical plant and property of the Church.

Cemetery Committee – This group ensures that the cemetery is maintained and funded. They are responsible for long-term planning, records, and care of the cemetery.

Catechist – These individuals teach and proclaim the Faith, giving witness to their faith in dedication to the life of the Church in our Faith Formation programs.

Nursing Home/Homebound Ministry - our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion can be called in a special way to minister to those of our community who are sick or are homebound, either due to illness or old age, and cannot attend Mass. In addition, they can minister to the faithful who are in nursing homes or in the local hospital.

Funeral Committee - These dedicated parishioners will work to organize and assist at the meal following a family death.

Quilters Group - While sharing faith and fellowship, their hands and minds create beautiful quilts, one of which is put up for raffle each year at the 4th of July Homecoming. The proceeds are used for supplies and to offer donations to the church and other organizations.

Gardening/Landscape - These dedicated parishioners work tirelessly to keep our parish grounds beautiful throughout the year, especially spring, summer and fall.

Church Decorating – These individuals help provide and put up seasonal decorations within the church to bring beauty and dignity to the liturgies being celebrated.

Respect Life - Respect Life seeks to provide information and organize activities that promote the teachings of the Church on the dignity of each human person from the moment of conception to a natural death. Efforts are ongoing to provide educational materials and helpful emails to those interested. As Catholics, we are all called to pray for and protect the dignity of all life.

Women's Group - The Women's Guild fosters spiritual, educational, charitable, and social activities for women of all ages. This group of women is dedicated to community service and social and spiritual enrichment of members. Throughout the year, these women assist with many parish activities, host events, support several charitable organizations, and sponsor projects throughout the community.

Men's Club – While we currently do not have a Men's Club, one could be initiated if there is enough interest. The idea behind a Men's Club is for men to come together to study and discuss their Catholic faith and Sacred Scripture, to hear from interesting issue-oriented speakers, and to develop greater spirituality in a spirit of fellowship and prayer.

Money Counters - Parishioners count and record the weekly offertory collection and special collections.
